Our Saints

JULY 31—IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA (1491-1556), born in the Basque region of Spain, was trained for a military career, which ended in 1521, when he was wounded in battle. During convalescence, he was deeply moved by meditations on the life of Christ, and eventually drafted his *Spiritual Exercises* in 1522. Ignatius gathered his closest companions into a company of preachers in 1534, and he was ordained a priest in 1538. The Society of Jesus (Jesuits) received official status in 1540, and they continue to bear the motto *Ad Maioram Dei Gloriam!* ("For the greater glory of God"). At his death in 1556, the Jesuits numbered about 1,000 members in 76 communities in 12 provinces, including Brazil, Japan, and India. Ignatius is the patron saint of retreatants and soldiers
